'My World Is Shattering': Foreign Students Stranded by Coronavirus – The New York Times reported last weekend that thousands of international students in the U.S. are struggling amidst the COVID-19 crisis. Many students are unable to go home to their families, and are struggling to pay for basic living expenses, including food and housing. Their financial difficulties are compounded by depreciating currency and visa restrictions which leave them unable to work.

Today you have an opportunity to do something to help. You can support vulnerable international students through the COVID-19 crisis and advocate for the future of intercultural exchange by doing one or all of the following:


- Email, tweet, or call Betsy DeVos, Secretary of Education to release aid to all college and university students who need help at this time. Join members of Congress in requesting to eliminate the restrictions she imposed on the CARES Act.

- Join the Alliance for International Exchange's <u>letter writing campaign</u> to Secretary Pompeo, reinforcing that international exchange programs are cultural exchanges, not work programs, and should not be included in any executive action regarding employment-based immigration.
