PROGRAM SNAPSHOT



One To World has three core areas of work: 1) enrichment programs for international students and Fulbright scholars; 2) professional development for staff at academic institutions; and 3) workshops for underresourced, K-12 students in New York City. Together, these programs foster curiosity, respect, inclusion, and community for a better world.

Career Readiness: International students engage with local professionals in employment workshops, job shadowing, and more to gain the tools needed to succeed in business—both in the U.S., and abroad.



Community Service Projects: Through partnerships with other local nonprofits, international students have the chance to give back to New York City and engage in the American tradition of volunteerism.

Conversations with World Leaders: Fulbright scholars meet leaders in business, education, and philanthropy for an intimate exchange of ideas and insights across cultures.

Dinner Diplomats & Holiday Hosting: Locals in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Pennsylvania host students in their homes for dinner, building connections and creating opportunities for New Yorkers and international students alike to learn more about international cultures, customs, and people.

Foreign Affairs Conferences: Our delegation of international students brings first-hand global perspectives to debates on American foreign policy with cadets and midshipmen at the U.S. Military and Naval Academies.



Global Classroom: International students and our expert staff provide local K-12 youth with meaningful opportunities to build their knowledge of and appreciation for other cultures, and increase their understanding of global crises and the role they can play to help solve them.

Membership Meetings: Staff at higher education academic institutions receive professional development

from experts to increase their capacity to best support international students.

Social Gatherings: Get-togethers at global restaurants, game nights, visits to cultural institutions, and group outings to sporting events allow our next generation of global leaders to experience American culture and connect with one another.

Tours: Local guides take our international students for curated tours throughout the city, allowing them to experience the rich tapestry that only New York has to offer.

256 **Global Classroom** workshops with 7 school and after-school partners.

400+ K-12 students who learned how to investigate, recognize, communicate, take action, and reflect on global issues and cultures.

28 international students served as Global Guides, bringing their cultures and knowledge to underresourced K-12 students.

40+ universities participated in our monthly professional development meetings, ensuring that our international students feel academically engaged and supported.





127 local residents opened their homes to our international students, ensuring they feel connected to their new neighbors and friends in the New York area.

966 Fulbright scholars and international students attended our tours, community service events, social gatherings, meals with local hosts, and more.


